For the Male and Female Songwriter of the Year categories, nominees are based on data from *MusicRow*'s Top Songwriter Chart.

All nominations are based on projects that were active between the period of June 1, 2022 and May 31, 2023. Continuing *MusicRow*'s tradition of recognizing talent behind the scenes, the Top 10 Album All-Star Musician Awards will be presented in conjunction with the *MusicRow* Awards. These honors salute Nashville's most in-demand studio players who performed on the most albums reaching the Top 10 of *Billboard*'s Top Country Albums chart during the eligibility period.

MusicRow Subscribers will vote to determine award winners.





PRODUCER OF THE YEAR: About the Nominees

Zach Crowell lent his production talent to Cole Swindell for his award-winning, multi-week No. 1 "She Had Me At Heads Carolina," in addition to other hits by the artist over the past year. He produced Dustin Lynch's record-breaking duet with MacKenzie Porter, "Thinking 'Bout You," which was the No. 1 song on the Mediabase 2022 Year-End Country Chart. Crowell's work can also be heard on Sam Hunt's rising new single "Outskirts," Russell Dickerson's "God Gave Me A Girl" and Conner Smith's "Creek Will Rise," as well as music from Jelly Roll and Madeline Merlo.

Shane McAnally was celebrated for his production credits on projects from Carly Pearce, Sam Hunt, Old Dominion, Kelsea Ballerini and more over the past year. Alongside Josh Osborne, McAnally worked on Pearce's 29: Written In Stone album, containing hits "What He Didn't Do," "Next Girl" and "Never Wanted To Be That Girl." He also lent his production skills to Old Dominion's Memory Lane project, Ballerini's Subject To Change album as well as singles for Hunt, Walker Hayes and Kylie Morgan.

Dan Huff continued his legacy of producing hit records over the past year. Continuing his long-standing relationship with Kane Brown, he lent his talents to his *Different Man* album, producing No. 1 hits "Like I Love Country Music," "Thank God," "One Mississippi" and "Bury Me In Georgia." Huff also produced Thomas Rhett's recent hits "Slow Down Summer" and "Half Of Me," Keith Urban's "Brown Eyes Baby" and Brett Young's "Dance With You," to name a few. His work can also be heard on music from Darius Rucker, Russell Dickerson, Brian Kelley, Kameron Marlowe, Restless Road, Caylee Hammack, Tiera Kennedy and more.

Joey Moi is the production architect for Morgan Wallen's record-breaking projects *Dangerous: The Double Album* and *One Thing At A Time*, both of which stayed in the top echelons of the country albums chart since their respective releases. Released in March, the record-shattering *One Thing At A Time* album has yielded hits such as "Last Night," "You Proof," "Thought You Should Know," "Don't Think Jesus" and "Thinkin' Bout Me." Moi also contributed to Hardy's *The Mockingbird & The Crow* album, as well as projects from Jake Owen, Lauren Alaina, Ernest and more.

Jay Joyce helmed the production on longtime client Lainey Wilson's fourth studio album, *Bell Bottom Country*, which won the ACM's Album of the Year prize and secured Wilson more hits with its "Heart Like a Truck" and "Watermelon Moonshine." He also produced another longtime collaborator Eric Church's 2021 triple album *Heart & Soul*, containing recent hits such as "Hell Of A View," and Corey Kent's major label debut album *Blacktop* and new music from LANCO.

In addition to recent production credits with Russell Dickerson, Chase Matthew and more over the past year, Alysa Vanderheym really impressed with her work with Kelsea Ballerini. Vanderheym co-produced Ballerini's lauded Rolling Up The Welcome Mat EP, which has become some of the star's most well received work to date by both fans and critics. Vanderheym's talents can also be heard on music from Tyler Rich, Joy Oladokun, Fancy Hagood and more.







BREAKTHROUGH SONGWRITER: About the Nominees

Trannie Anderson scored her first No. 1 hit this year with Lainey Wilson's "Heart Like A Truck," which she co-wrote with the country star and Dallas Wilson. Anderson has also written songs recorded by Tenille Arts, Gabby Barrett, Dan + Shay, Hannah Dasher, Pentatonix, Nate Smith, Noah Thompson and Meghan Trainor.

Rian Ball hit the top of the charts for the first time with "Down Home," which he co-wrote with Jimmie Allen, Cameron Bedell and Tate Howell, and Allen recorded. Ball has also had songs cut by Chris Young, Michael Ray, Filmore and more artists in other genres.

Cameron Bedell earned his first No. 1 with Jimmie Allen's "Down Home," which he co-wrote with Allen, Rian Ball and Tate Howell. Dylan Scott, Hailey Whitters, Lauren Alaina, Seaforth and more have cut Bedell's songs, and he produces Tiera Kennedy.

Jimi Bell scored his first No. 1 hit with Jon Pardi's "Last Night Lonely." He co-wrote the tune with Joe Fox and Dylan Marlowe. Bell's songs have also been recorded by Brantley Gilbert, Bailey Zimmerman, Kip Moore and more.

Rocky Block notched his first top 10 with Morgan Wallen's "Man Made A Bar," featuring Eric Church. He co-wrote the song with Jordan Dozzi, Larry Fleet and Brett Tyler, which is one of four of his credits on Wallen's third album. Block has also had songs recorded by Breland, Jake Owen, Nelly, Jordan Davis, Chris Lane and more.

Will Bundy hit the top of the charts for the first time with "Half Of Me," recorded by Thomas Rhett featuring Riley Green. He co-wrote the song with Rhett, Josh Thompson and Rhett Akins. Bundy has also written songs recorded by Keith Urban, Jordan Davis, Parker McCollum, Jon Pardi, Jason Aldean and more.

John Byron had a big hit with Morgan Wallen's "Last Night," which he co-wrote with Ashley Gorley, Jacob Kasher Hindlin and Ryan Vojtesak. It is one of nine songs Byron co-wrote for Wallen's third album. He's also had songs cut by Chris Lane and Sean Stemaly.

Jamie Davis hit the top of the charts for the first time with Luke Combs' "The Kind of Love We Make," which he cowrote with Combs, Dan Isbell and Reid Isbell. Davis has also had songs recorded by Lily Rose, Jenna Paulette, Leith Loftin and others, and is also a member of Combs' touring band.

Jordan Dozzi co-wrote the Top 10 hit, "Man Made A Bar," recorded by Morgan Wallen featuring Eric Chruch. Dozzi co-wrote the tune with Rocky Block, Larry Fleet and Brett Tyler. He has also had cuts with Nelly, Jake Owen, Seaforth, Chase Matthew and more.

David Fanning has had lots of success as a producer and manager to Parmalee. He added "hit songwriter" to his resume with "Take My Name," recorded by Parmalee and co-written with Matt Thomas, Ashley Gorley and Ben Johnson, and "Tennessee Orange," co-written and recorded by Megan Moroney along with Ben Williams and Paul Jenkins.

Joe Fox topped the charts with the Jon Pardi-recorded "Last Night Loney," which he co-wrote with Jimi Bell and Dylan Marlowe, whom he produces. Fox has had songs recorded by Blake Shelton and Matt Stell as well.

Jaxson Free celebrated his first No. 1 with "Thank God," recorded by Kane and Katelyn Brown. He wrote the duet with Christian Davis, Kyle Fishman, Josh Hoge and Jared Mullins. Free also has cuts with Chase Rice, Dalton Dover, Zach Seabaugh and others.

Jacob Hackworth scored a big hit with Bailey Zimmerman's "Rock and a Hard Place," which he co-wrote with Jet Harvey and Heath Warren. Hackworth has also had songs recorded by Chase Matthew and Logan Crosby.

Jet Harvey hit the top of the charts with Bailey Zimmerman's "Rock and a Hard Place," which he co-wrote with Jacob Hackworth and Heath Warren. The song was Harvey's first cut.

Tate Howell earned his first No. 1 with Jimmie Allen's "Down Home," which he co-wrote with Allen, Rian Ball and Cameron Bedell. He has also had songs recorded by Nate Smith and LANCO.

Reid Isbell hit the top of the charts with Luke Combs' "The Kind of Love We Make." He co-wrote the tune with Combs, Dan Isbell and Jamie Davis. Isbell has also had cuts with Jon Pardi, Lainey Wilson, Kameron Marlowe, King Calaway and more



BREAKTHROUGH ARTIST-WRITER: About the Nominees

Zach Bryan made an indelible impact this year with the release of multiple projects. His 34-song American Heartbreak debuted at No. 5 on the US Billboard 200. The album was preceded by six singles, including Bryan's most successful single to date, the solely-written "Something in the Orange." The tune became the longest charting country single for a male artist on Billboard's Hot 100 at an astounding 65 consecutive weeks. The evergreen track surpassed Carrie Underwood's "Before he Cheats" to become the second longest-charting country song of all time. American Heartbreak has remained in the top 10 in the US for more than a year after its initial release. To date, Bryan has accrued in excess of 6.3 billion global streams and 11 total RIAA track and album certifications. He is currently on the road on his completely sold-out "Burn Burn North American Tour."

Jackson Dean broke ground this past year with his old school, gritty, lyric-driven, outlaw style of country. His co-written single "Don't Come Lookin'" was the fastest debut to reach No. 1 in 2022 and cemented Jackson as the youngest solo male country artist to reach the top of the charts with a debut. The song landed spots on the Billboard Hot 100, the soundtrack for Netflix's *The Ice Road* and a John Dutton scene in *Yellowstone*. The rugged music video for the track also earned a nomination at the 2023 CMT Music Awards for Breakthrough Male Video of the Year. His sophomore single, "Fearless (The Echo)" is currently climbing the country radio charts after being mostadded upon impact. Dean's breakout landed him on a slew of artist to watch lists. Jackson has joined bills with superstar acts like Toby Keith, Miranda Lambert, Brantley Gilbert, Carly Pearce, Parker McCollum, Kane Brown, Jake Owen, Brooks & Dunn, Lee Brice, Hardy and Brothers Osborne.

Megan Moroney is a country newcomer with massive staying power. She broke onto the scene with her breakout, cowritten single "Tennessee Orange," an immediate smash that soon led to her signing with Sony Music Nashville/Columbia Records, in addition to notching her first No. 1 at country radio and earning an RIAA Platinum certification. Named a 2023 Artist to Watch by the likes of Amazon Music, Pandora, and Spotify, as well as an iHeart On The Verge Artist and one of CMT's Next Women of Country for 2023, Moroney released her debut album Lucky in May. Her accolades also include winning Breakthrough Female Video of the Year at the CMT Music Awards. She kicked off her first headline run with the sold-out "Pistol Made Of Roses Tour" and will embark on her sold-out "The Lucky Tour" this fall, bringing her magnetic live show to iconic venues across the U.S. — all while continuing a meteoric rise that now includes over 426 million total global streams to date.

Genre-bending singer-songwriter Jelly Roll has guietly been building a remarkable career, under the radar and on his own terms. Since his days selling his mix tapes out of his car, he has constantly been releasing new music, touring relentlessly, engaging a rabid fanbase and creating videos that have amassed more than 4 billion views on YouTube. His 2020 single "Save Me" set the stage for his new season of life and took him to new heights, with more than 160 million views on YouTube and a Platinum certification from the RIAA. His 2021 album Ballads of the Broken featured a multi-week No. 1 rock hit "Dead Man Walking" and his No. 1 country debut single "Son of a Sinner," both of which he co-wrote. His newest album, Whitsitt Chapel, was released earlier this year earned the biggest opening week for a first entry on the Top Country Albums charts since the list adopted a consumption-based methodology in 2017. The three-time CMT Award winner is currently on the road on his 44-city "Backroad Baptism Tour."

Since **Nate Smith** made his way to Nashville, he has made a huge splash with songs such as his Platinum-certified multiweek No. 1 hit "Whiskey On You," which he co-wrote. The tune amassed over 7.5 million total global on-demand streams in its first week, reaching No. 10 on the Country On-Demand Streaming Chart and has racked up over 320 million total global on-demand streams to date. Smith released his debut, self-titled album along with the deluxe version earlier this year. The hefty 26-song project hit No. 6 on *Billboard*'s Country album charts and No. 30 on the *Billboard* Top 200. His latest single off the album, "World On Fire," is impacting country radio now. The CMT Awards and ACM Awards nominee is currently on tour with Thomas Rhett and will hit the road with Cole Swindell this fall.

At light speed, Bailey Zimmerman has already surpassed 2 billion global streams to date and recently celebrated a six-week No. 1 single with his multi-Platinum smash "Rock And A Hard Place." His record-shattering 2022 debut EP, Leave The Light On, propelled the breakout superstar to close out 2022 as Billboard's No. 2 Top New Country Artist. In addition, he received two Platinum certifications from the RIAA, beginning with his co-written No. 1 debut single "Fall In Love," the fastest debut single to reach No. 1 at country radio since 2015 and the first debut hit to make it all the way to No. 1 on the Billboard Country Airplay chart in 2022. His recently released debut, Religiously. The Album., marked not only the biggest streaming debut album of the year across all genres, but also the biggest streaming country debut of all time. Zimmerman is currently out on the road on the Morgan Wallen's "One Night At A Time World Tour."

SONG OF THE YEAR: About the Nominees

"Light On In The Kitchen"

Ashley McBryde's single "Light On In The Kitchen" debuted to critical acclaim earlier this year. The tune, written by McBryde with Connie Harrington and Jessi Alexander, celebrates the warm glow shared across homes around the world, a symbol of affection signaling that someone may be missing tonight, but thoughts of them are present. In the song, McBryde retells comforting advice she's heard, such as, "Honey trust yourself, You better love yourself cause 'till you do, you ain't no good for anybody else... bless your heart, you'll need someone to listen. That's why I leave a light on in the kitchen."

"Tennessee Orange"

"Tennessee Orange" launched Megan Moroney's career into stardom. Moroney co-wrote the tune with Ben Williams, David Fanning and Paul Jenkins, and her independent release of the track made waves on social media with its lyrics about a Georgia girl falling in love with a Tennessee boy. "He ain't from where we're from but he feels like home," Moroney sings, "In Georgia they call it a sin, I'm wearing Tennessee orange for him." After being sent to country radio as Moroney's debut single, "Tennessee Orange" hit No. 1 on the charts in June. It appears on her major label debut album Lucky, released in May

"Wait In The Truck"

Hardy and Lainey Wilson made waves late last year with "Wait In The Truck," a murder ballad about an abused woman being avenged. Co-written by Michael Hardy, Hunter Phelps, Jordan Schmidt and Renee Blair, "Wait In The Truck" features Hardy singing verses about finding a scared woman out in a storm, taking her to the home she was escaping and killing her abuser. In the chorus, Wilson sings, "I never thought my day of justice would come from a judge under a seat, but I knew right then I'd never get hit again when he said to me... wait in the truck." The RIAA Platinum certified bombshell topped the Mediabase country chart and won multiple ACM Awards.

"'98 Braves"

"'98 Braves" is a unique song that appears on Morgan Wallen's third studio album *One Thing At A Time*. The tune, written by John Byron, Josh Miller and Travis Wood, recalls a 1998 baseball game when the San Diego Padres beat the Atlanta Braves. The songwriters compare the heartbreaking loss to a relationship that almost worked, but didn't. Wallen communicates it perfectly, singing, "We swung for the fences and came up short. Yea, you win some and lose some, it ain't always home runs and that's just the way life plays. If we were a team and love was a game, we'd been the '98 Braves'

"Memory Lane"

Old Dominion impressed earlier this year with "Memory Lane." The chart-topping tune was written by the band's Matthew Ramsey, Brad Tursi and Trevor Rosen alongside Jessie Jo Dillon, and elicits nostalgia for life's best moments. "If I could buy a house on memory lane, I'd put my money down and sign my name," Ramsey sings in the song's opening line. "Memory Lane" served as the title track for an 8-song EP that started a new chapter of great music for the award-winning band.

"Standing Room Only"

With "Standing Room Only," Tim McGraw gives a heartfelt examination of what it means to truly live life fully. Written by Craig Wiseman, Tommy Cecil and Patrick Murphy, the tune is the title track to McGraw's upcoming album. It quickly resonated with fans, eliciting a similar reaction to that of McGraw's titanic "Live Like You Were Dying." The country crooner sings that he wants to, "Start forgivin' and start forgettin', be somebody that's worth rememberin'. Live a life so when I die there's standing room only."

DISCOVERY ARTIST OF THE YEAR: About the Nominees

Since arriving on the scene, **Ashley Cooke** has garnered over 200 million global streams with chart-climbing hits like "Never Til Now" with Brett Young, Ryman and Grand Ole Opry debuts, and national TV appearances on ABC's *The Bachelorette*. Cooke has recently been out on the road with Cole Swindell, Luke Bryan and more. In July, Cooke released her 24-track debut album, *Shot In The Dark*, that infuses heartfelt lyrics, captivating melodies and raw relatability as she invites listeners to come along for the ride. Among the album's highlights are collaborations with some of Nashville's most sought after names including Young, Jackson Dean, Colbie Caillat and Nate Smith. *Shot In The Dark* has already been making its mark, securing the No. 6 position in the Top 10 of Spotify's Top Debut Albums USA.

Made up of sisters Danica and Devynn Hart along with first cousin Trea Swindle, **Chapel Hart** took 2022 by storm. Following his headlining trek, Marlowe will be on the road the rest of this summer and fall with Dierks Bentley, Parker McCollum and Jordan Davis, and is set to open for Luke Bryan on his fall "Farm Tour" 2023. Marlowe is a member of the CMT Listen Up and Opry NextStage classes of 2023.

Kylie Morgan is currently turning heads with her clever and relatable songs. Pairing articulate, coming-of-age revelations with fun, up-tempo anthems, her recently EP, P.S., features seven tracks each co-written by Morgan, including her debut single to country radio, "If He Wanted To He Would." P.S. is the anticipated follow-up to her breakout EP, Love, Kylie – a bold introduction that scored the Oklahoma native a place as one of CMT's Next Women of Country, VEVO's 2021 DSCVR Artists to Watch and CMA's coveted KixStart program. Already surpassing 250 million global streams, Morgan has been praised for her powerful voice and smart songwriting. Currently on her first-ever headlining "Independent With You Tour," she has previously opened for artists including Dan + Shay, Little Big Town, Maren Morris, Kip Moore, Jason Derulo, Gavin DeGraw, Brett Eldredge and Billy Currington.


Rising singer-songwriter **Conner Smith**'s authentic storytelling and rich, soulful voice has resonated with audiences nationwide, earning him a dedicated and passionate following. His Top-30-bound single "Creek Will Rise" has quickly become an anthem among his loyal fanbase and amassed over 16 million streams to date. 

BREAKTHROUGH ARTIST OF THE YEAR: About the Nominees

Jackson Dean broke ground this past year with his old school, gritty, lyric-driven, outlaw style of country. His single, "Don't Come Lookin'" was the fastest debut to reach No. 1 in 2022 and cemented Dean as the youngest solo male country artist to reach the top of the charts with a debut. The song landed spots on the Billboard Hot 100, the soundtrack for Netflix's The Ice Road and a John Dutton scene in Yellowstone. The rugged music video for the track also earned a nomination at the 2023 CMT Music Awards for Breakthrough Male Video of the Year. His sophomore single, "Fearless (The Echo)" is currently climbing the country radio charts after being mostadded upon impact. Dean's breakout landed him on a slew of artist to watch lists. Dean has joined bills with superstar acts like Toby Keith, Miranda Lambert, Brantley Gilbert, Carly Pearce, Parker McCollum, Kane Brown, Jake Owen, Brooks & Dunn, Lee Brice, Hardy and Brothers Osborne.

Megan Moroney is a country newcomer with massive staying power. She broke onto the scene with her breakout single "Tennessee Orange," an immediate smash that soon led to her signing with Sony Music Nashville/Columbia Records, in addition to notching her first No. 1 at country radio and earning an RIAA Platinum certification. Named a 2023 Artist to Watch by the likes of Amazon Music, Pandora, and Spotify, as well as an iHeart On The Verge Artist and one of CMT's Next Women of Country for 2023, Moroney released her debut album Lucky in May. Her accolades also include winning Breakthrough Female Video of the Year at the CMT Music Awards. She made her debut appearance on NBC's Today and kicked off her first headline run with the sold-out "Pistol Made Of Roses Tour" and will embark on her sold-out "The Lucky Tour" this fall, bringing her magnetic live show to iconic venues across the U.S. — all while continuing a meteoric rise that now includes over 426 million total global streams to date.

Genre-bending singer-songwriter Jelly Roll has quietly been building a remarkable career, under the radar and on his own terms. Since his days selling his mix tapes out of his car, he has constantly been releasing new music, touring relentlessly, engaging a rabid fanbase and creating videos that have amassed more than four billion views on YouTube. His 2020 single "Save Me" set the stage for his new season of life and took him to new heights, with more than 160 million views on YouTube and Platinum certification from the RIAA. His 2021 album Ballads of the Broken featured a multi-week No. 1 rock hit "Dead Man Walking" and his No. 1 country debut single "Son of a Sinner." His newest album, Whitsitt Chapel, was released earlier this year and earned the biggest opening week for a first entry on the Top Country Albums charts since the list adopted a consumption-based methodology in 2017. The three-time CMT Award winner is currently on the road on his 44-city "Backroad Baptism Tour."

Since **Nate Smith** made his way to Nashville, he has made a huge splash with songs such as his Platinum-certified multiweek No. 1 hit "Whiskey On You," which he co-wrote. The tune amassed over 7.5 million total global on-demand streams in its first week, reaching No. 10 on the Country On-Demand Streaming Chart, and has racked up over 320 million total global on-demand streams to date. Smith released his debut, self-titled album along with the deluxe version earlier this year. The hefty 26-song project hit No. 6 on *Billboard*'s Country album charts and No. 30 on the *Billboard* Top 200. His latest single off the album, "World On Fire," is impacting country radio now. The CMT Awards and ACM Awards nominee is currently on tour with Thomas Rhett and will hit the road with Cole Swindell this fall.

After working at it for over a decade, Hailey Whitters had a breakout year with her 2022 album *Raised*, which contained her infectious hit "Everything She Ain't." The Gold-certified tune has been played over 175 million times on TikTok, inspiring multiple trends on the platform, and has spent 64 weeks on their Country Airplay chart and marked her first appearance on the Hot 100 chart in May. Whitters won the ACM New Female Artist of the Year earlier this year and just released her follow-up EP, *I'm In Love*. Following her headlining "Raised" tour, she supported Shania Twain on her "Queen of Me Tour," as well as select dates on Dierks Bentley's tour. This September, she will hit the road with Eric Church followed by a run of dates supporting Luke Bryan. Whitters kicked off 2023 with her late night debut on *Jimmy Kimmel Live!*, her morning TV debut on NBC's *Today* and a performance on *The Kelly Clarkson Show*.

At light speed, Bailey Zimmerman has already surpassed 2 billion global streams to date and recently celebrated a sixweek No. 1 single with his multi-Platinum smash "Rock and a Hard Place." His record-shattering 2022 debut EP, Leave The Light On, propelled the breakout superstar to close out 2022 as Billboard's No. 2 Top New Country Artist. In addition, he received two Platinum certifications from the RIAA, beginning with his No. 1 debut single "Fall In Love," the fastest debut single to reach No. 1 at country radio since 2015 and the first debut hit to make it all the way to No. 1 on the Billboard Country Airplay chart in 2022. His recently released debut, Religiously. The Album., marked not only the biggest streaming debut album of the year across all genres, but also the biggest streaming country debut of all time. Zimmerman is currently out on the road on the Morgan Wallen's "One Night At A Time World Tour."

FEMALE ARTIST OF THE YEAR: About the Nominees

Kelsea Ballerini broke new ground this past year with the released of her fourth album, Subject To Change. The first single "Heartfirst," quickly took over airwaves as the most added song at country radio, was certified Gold by the RIAA and earned Ballerini a Grammy nomination for Best Country Solo Performance. Soon after releasing Subject To Change, Ballerini surprised fans with the release of her intimate sixsong EP Rolling Up the Welcome Mat. The EP, along with an accompanying short film written and directed by Ballerini, became an instant hit with fans and debuted to universal acclaim from critics. On the heels of the EP's success, Ballerini made her Saturday Night Live debut on March 4, 2023. After the Grand Ole Opry member wrapped a stint as special quest on Kenny Chesney's "I Go Back 2023 Tour." She sold-out three legs of her exclusive headlining "Heartfirst Tour." Her tune "If You Go Down (I'm Going Down Too)" continues to climb at country radio.

Miranda Lambert is the most-awarded artist in ACM history and has notched 11 No. 1 hit radio singles, more than 70 prestigious awards and countless sales certifications. Her eighth solo album, Palomino, arrived in 2022 as the largest female country album debut of the year and earned a Grammy nomination for Best Country Album. Lambert also became a New York Times best-selling author this year with her first book, Y'all Eat Yet. With her headlining "Velvet Rodeo Las Vegas" residency extended through late 2023 at Planet Hollywood Resort & Casino's Bakkt Theater, the top streaming female country artist of 2022 was also named to the TIME100 list honoring the world's most influential people. She is also the first female artist to have her own venue on Broadway in Nashville with her Casa Rosa Tex-Mex cantina. An avid animal lover, Lambert's MuttNation Foundation has raised over \$8 million since its inception in 2009.


Grammy, CMA and ACM award winner Ashley McBryde elevated her artistry this year with the release of her collaborative project Ashley McBryde Presents: Lindeville. The album earned McBryde a Grammy nomination for Best Country Album, making her a six-time nominee. She will release her next studio album The Devil I Know in September, which features the chart-climbing lead single "Light On In The Kitchen." The now Grand Ole Opry member hit the scene with her 2018 major label debut Girl Going Nowhere. Her follow-up, Never Will, was the only album nominated for Country Album of the Year by the ACMs, CMAs and the Recording Academy in the same award season. Her Grammy-winning duet with Carly Pearce, "Never Wanted To Be That Girl," went all the way to No. 1 and earned McBryde and Pearce a CMA, ACM and Grammy award. McBryde is currently on the road with Jelly Roll and recently announced "The Devil I Know" tour.

Grammy Award-winning singer-songwriter Carly Pearce raised the bar industry-wide with her critically acclaimed and commercially lauded third studio album 29: Written in Stone, which earned her third and fourth No. 1 hits with "Never Wanted to Be That Girl" featuring Ashley McBryde and "What He Didn't Do." Her duet with McBryde went on to win both the ACM and CMA Music Event of the Year, Best Country Duo/Group Performance at the Grammys and it became the third duet between two solo women to top Billboard's Country Airplay chart. The Grand Ole Opry and Kentucky Music Hall of Fame member recently started her next musical chapter with "We Don't Fight Anymore," featuring Chris Stapleton, which earned her the biggest add date of her career thus far. Pearce will hit the road in October on her "Country Music Made Me Do It Tour."

Carrie Underwood is a multi-format, multi-media superstar, spanning achievements in music, television and film, and as a New York Times bestselling author and successful entrepreneur. She has sold more than 85 million records worldwide and recorded 28 No. 1 singles-14 of which she co-wrote. She is the most-awarded female country artist for singles in RIAA history and has seven albums that are certified multi-Platinum or Platinum by the RIAA, with over 72 million total RIAA certifications to date, all while continuing to sell out arena tours across North America and the UK. Underwood released her most recent album, Denim & Rhinestones, in 2022, and she also recently completed her 43-city U.S. arena tour, "The Denim & Rhinestones Tour." In addition to becoming the first artist to perform at the new Resorts World Theatre with her ongoing "Reflection: The Las Vegas Residency," Underwood just launched her exclusive year-round SiriusXM channel, Carrie's Country. Her deluxe edition of Denim & Rhinestones, featuring six new tracks, will be out on Sept. 22.

Breakout star Lainey Wilson was the leading female nominee and winner at the 2023 ACM awards with Female Vocalist of the Year, Album of The Year, Visual Media and Musical Event of the Year. She's also the reigning CMA 2022 Female Vocalist and New Artist of the Year. After landing her first No. 1 with her Platinum-certified ACM Song of the Year, "Things A Man Oughta Know," Wilson has revisited the top of the charts with the two-week No. 1 hit "Never Say Never" with Cole Swindell, as well as her third and fourth No. 1 songs with "Heart Like a Truck" and collaboration with Hardy, "Wait In The Truck." Her critically acclaimed album, Bell Bottom Country, reached No. 9 on Billboard's Country Albums Chart, quickly rose to No. 1 on iTunes charts and has amassed over 350 million streams to date. Most recently, she made her acting debut in Season 5 of the smash hit series Yellowstone as a musician character named Abby.



MALE ARTIST OF THE YEAR: About the Nominees

Since the arrival of his self-titled, 2x Platinum debut album in December 2016. Kane Brown has continued to expand the perception of country music and break musical boundaries. Named to the *Time100* list of the most influential people in the world, five time American Music Award winner Brown has over 13 billion streams, multiple multi-Platinum certifications, sold out arenas all across the world with more than four million tickets sold internationally, and made history as the first artist ever to lead all five of Billboard's main country charts simultaneously. With the release of his most recent album, Different Man, Brown earned his ninth career No. 1 hit, the 3x ACM-nominated Platinum-selling single, "Thank God," as well as hits with "Like I Love Country Music," "One Mississippi" and "Bury Me in Georgia." Brown earned his first-ever nomination for the ACM's Entertainer of the Year this year and became the first Black artist to headline Boston's iconic Fenway Park solo.

Reigning two-time CMA Entertainer of the Year Luke Combs has notched 16 consecutive No. 1 hits at country radio and over 337 million global streams to date. The Grand Ole Opry member is also an eight-time CMA, three-time ACM and threetime Billboard Music Award winner. He recently topped the charts with his version of Tracy Chapman's Grammy Awardwinning song, "Fast Car," which was certified RIAA Platinum just 16 weeks after it was released. The track is from Combs' fourth full-length album, Gettin' Old, following Growin' Up, 2019's 3-time Platinum What You See is What You Get and his 4-time Platinum debut This One's For You. Known for his electric live shows, Combs also recently expanded his massive sold-out "World Tour," adding four new US stadium shows due to overwhelming demand. With 44 shows across three continents and 16 countries, the record-breaking run is the largest tour ever for a country artist. Partnered with Opry Entertainment Group, Combs plans to open a massive multilevel entertainment complex in downtown Nashville during summer of 2024.

Having just notched his sixth career No. 1 single and third multi-week No. 1 with "Next Thing You Know," Jordan Davis is dominating the country scene. "Next Thing You Know" was Davis' third consecutive multi-week No. 1 off of his Goldcertified sophomore album, Bluebird Days. His previous two singles from Bluebird Days, "What My World Spins Around" and "Buy Dirt" ft. Luke Bryan, were 3-week and 2-week No. 1s, respectively. This year, Davis has tallied multiple awards nominations and wins, including his first ACM Male Vocalist of the Year nomination. He was a finalist for Top Country Song at the 2022 Billboard Music Awards and earned a nomination for Musical Event of the Year at the 55th CMA Awards, as well as nominations for Music Event, Single and Song of the Year at the 57th ACM Awards, and AMA Award and iHeart Award nominations. He is the reigning winner for CMA Song of Year and earned a win for NSAI Song of the Year. Davis is currently out on the road on his headlining "Damn Good Time Tour."

One of the country's most respected and beloved musicians, Chris Stapleton celebrated a year full of achievements this past year. He was named Entertainer of the Year at the 58th ACM Awards, resulting in a prestigious ACM Triple Crown Award, an elite honor that has been presented to only seven country acts in the history of the Academy of Country Music Awards. He also won his sixth Male Vocalist of the Year at the 2022 CMA Awards, setting the record for most wins ever in the category, and gave a rousing performance of the National Anthem at Super Bowl LVII. Currently in the midst of his extensive "All-American Road Show" tour, Stapleton recently announced his new album, Higher, will release in November. The new album follows 2020's acclaimed Starting Over, which went on to win three awards at the 67th Annual Grammys-Best Country Album, Best Country Solo Performance ("You Should Probably Leave") and Best Country Song ("Cold") – in addition to earning Album of the Year honors at both the CMA and ACM Awards.

In the spring of 2022, Cole Swindell released his fourth studio album, Stereotype, to massive success. The project charted three back-to-back, Platinum-certified, multi-week No. 1 hits, including "Single Saturday Night," "Never Say Never" (with Lainey Wilson) and, most recently, his five-week chart-topper "She Had Me At Heads Carolina." The latter garnered three ACM Awards and an iHeart Music Award for Country Song of the Year. In 2022, Swindell spent a total of 27 weeks in the Top 5 of the country singles chart with "Never Say Never" (8 weeks) and "She Had Me At Heads Carolina" (21 weeks). In the 10 years since his debut on Warner Music Nashville, Swindell has racked up an impressive 12 No. 1 singles as an artist-13 as a songwriter—as well as 12 certified Platinum singles, two Platinum-certified albums and a Gold-certified album. He is currently out on the road on Thomas Rhett's "Home Team Tour" and will headline again this fall on his "Twelve Tour."

With over 18 billion on-demand streams and nine charttoppers at country radio, Morgan Wallen has had unparalleled success since his debut in 2016. His second full-length project, Dangerous: The Double Album, topped 2021's all-genre Billboard 200 Albums year-end chart and notched historical chart status as Billboard's longest running Top 10 album in history for a solo artist. Wallen followed the 5-time Platinum, ACM Album of the Year with 2023's 36-song, deeply personal third studio album, One Thing At A Time, which reigned atop the all-genre Billboard 200 chart for 12 consecutive weeks, the most weeks at No. 1 for a country album in over 30 years. Wallen recently became first artist to have three singles simultaneously in the top 10 on country radio with "Last Night," "One Thing At A Time" and "Thought You Should Know." He is currently on his "One Night At A Time World Tour," crisscrossing the globe and breaking attendance records in his wake.



GROUP/DUO ARTIST OF THE YEAR: About the Nominees

The reigning CMA and ACM Duo of the Year winners, Brothers Osborne are connected by not just blood, but also a lifetime of performing together. The siblings, John and TJ, took home their first Grammy in 2022, winning Best Country Duo/Group Performance for their song "Younger Me," inspired by TJ's recent coming out. The song is featured on the deluxe version of their Grammy-nominated album, *Skeletons*. The band has been nominated for 10 Grammys in total, standing as a five-time CMA Vocal Duo of the Year and a four-time ACM Duo of the Year. Their critically acclaimed hit songs have tallied multiple RIAA Gold and Platinum certifications, while surpassing more than 2.7 billion global streams. Brothers Osborne's upcoming, self-titled fourth studio album is set to release in September and features the chart-climbing single "Nobody's Nobody." The duo's latest headlining "We're Not For Everyone Tour" hit more than 50 markets.

Award-winning group, Little Big Town first entered the music scene over 20 years ago. Comprised of Karen Fairchild, Kimberly Schlapman, Phillip Sweet and Jimi Westbrook, the band has celebrated multiple No. 1 singles, including "Pontoon," "Tornado" and "Day Drinking," as well as the historymaking, best-selling country single of 2015 "Girl Crush" and the Grammy-winning, multi-week No. 1 single "Better Man." The band's self-produced ninth studio album Nightfall was released January 2020 and hit the top of the Billboard Country Charts. The record included critically acclaimed and Grammynominated "The Daughters," "Over Drinking" and "Wine, Beer, Whiskey." Little Big Town has earned more than 45 award show nominations and has taken home nearly 20 awards, including multiple Grammy, AMA, People's Choice, CMA and ACM Awards, in addition to an Emmy Award. Their 10th studio album Mr. Sun debuted as the Top Country Album by a group in 2022.

Since Maddie & Tae broke onto the scene in 2013 with their Platinum-selling smash, "Girl In A Country Song," the duo's Maddie Font and Tae Kerr have charmed fans with their tight harmonies, unbreakable bond and honest songwriting. In 2022, the two released volumes 1 and 2 of their Through The Madness projects, which follows their No. 1 debuting The Way It Feels album, including the 3-times Platinum-certified No. 1 hit, "Die From A Broken Heart." With "Die From A Broken Heart" topping the country airplay charts, Maddie & Tae became the first and only female twosome with multiple No. 1s. They took home Group/Duo Video of the Year at the 2022 CMT Music Awards and were nominated an eighth time for Vocal Duo of the Year at the 56th CMA Awards. Maddie & Tae's headlining "All Song No Static Tour" sold out major markets coast-to-coast in 2022, with additional shows extending through spring of 2023. The duo recently started a new chapter of music with the release of their new track, "Heart They Didn't Break."

Old Dominion has carved out a space for themselves at the forefront of country music with their clever lyrics and an infectious sound created by members Matthew Ramsey, Trevor Rosen, Brad Tursi, Whit Sellers and Geoff Sprung. Since breaking onto the music scene, the band has notched nine No. 1 singles at country radio, surpassed five billion ondemand streams, earned a dozen RIAA Platinum and Gold single certifications and headlined arenas and amphitheaters around the globe. The band are currently the reigning sixtime Academy of Country Music and five-time Country Music Association Group of the Year. Old Dominion's 8-song Memory Lane EP was released in June, and its title track recently topped the charts. They are currently out on the road on their "No Bad Vibes Tour," which has sold out multiple dates and spread the joy found in Old Dominion hits.

The last few years for **Parmalee** have been nothing short of career years. The band—comprised of brothers Matt Thomas and Scott Thomas, along with their cousin Barry Knox and friend Josh McSwain—first topped the charts in 2013 with "Carolina." The band didn't return to the chart pinnacle until 2021 with their Platinum-certified "Just The Way" with Blanco Brown. They followed its massive success with "Take My Name," which was *Billboard*'s Most Played Country Song of 2022. Their latest single "Girl In Mine" is Top 10 and climbing. Back in radio's good graces, Parmalee recently announced they will release a new album, *For You 2*, in September. With a full slate of summer festivals and amphitheaters, Parmalee will take their hit-packed set on tour with Grammy Award winners Train, later this summer. In July, the band celebrated the tenth anniversary of their Grand Ole Opry debut.

Founded in 2014 by the husband-and-wife duo Michael Trotter Jr. and Tanya Trotter, The War And Treaty have emerged as one of the most electrifying new acts in American music. Earning respect, they've gone on to appear as top-flight collaborators, and have been recognized by the Country Music Hall of Fame, the Grand Ole Opry and the Americana Music Association as 2022 Duo/Group of the Year. The duo have dominated stages across the globe including North America, Europe, Italy, Australia, and Ireland, while headlining their own shows and opening for a diverse group of living legends such as Al Green, Brandi Carlile, Jason Isbell, John Legend, Lauren Daigle and Van Morrison among them. The War And Treaty released their major label debut album Lover's Game in March. The Dave Cobb-produced project included fan-favorites "Dumb Luck," "Blank Page," "That's How Love Is Made" and "Have You A Heart."



With the release of his most recent album, Different Man, Brown earned his ninth career No. 1 hit, the 3x ACM-nominated Platinum-selling single, "Thank God," as well as hits with "Like I Love Country Music," "One Mississippi" and "Bury Me in Georgia." Brown earned his first-ever nomination for the ACM's Entertainer of the Year this year and became the first Black artist to headline Boston's iconic Fenway Park solo.

A seven-time ACM Award winner, four-time CMA Award winner and 10-time Grammy nominee, **Eric Church** has amassed a passionate fan base around the globe known as the Church Choir, as well as a beloved catalog of music. His most recent critically acclaimed and chart-topping project, the *Heart & Soul* triple album, yielded the Gold-certified No. 1 "Hell of a View" and recent Top 5 hit "Heart On Fire" as well as his latest single, "Doing Life With Me," climbing the charts at country radio now. Through the fall, Church will trek across North America on "The Outsiders Revival Tour," bringing with him a rotating lineup of emerging artists along for the first fully outdoor tour of his career. Church is currently the 18th artist-in-residence at Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum, where he also is the subject of a new exhibition. He will soon open Chief's, a six-story venue on Nashville's famed lower Broadway.

Reigning two-time CMA Entertainer of the Year Luke Combs has notched 16 consecutive No. 1 hits at country radio and over 337 million global streams to date. The Grand Ole Opry member is also an eight-time CMA, three-time ACM and threetime Billboard Music Award winner. He recently topped the charts with his version of Tracy Chapman's Grammy Awardwinning song, "Fast Car," which was certified RIAA Platinum just 16 weeks after it was released. The track is from Combs' fourth full-length album, Gettin' Old, following Growin' Up, 2019's 3-time Platinum What You See is What You Get and his 4-time Platinum debut This One's For You. Known for his electric live shows, Combs also recently expanded his massive sold-out "World Tour," adding four new US stadium shows due to overwhelming demand. With 44 shows across three continents and 16 countries, the record-breaking run is the largest tour ever for a country artist. Partnered with Opry Entertainment Group, Combs plans to open a massive multilevel entertainment complex in downtown Nashville during summer of 2024

One of the country's most respected and beloved musicians, Chris Stapleton celebrated a year full of achievements this past year. He was named Entertainer of the Year at the 58th ACM Awards, resulting in a prestigious ACM Triple Crown Award, an elite honor that has been presented to only seven country acts in the history of the Academy of Country Music Awards. He also won his sixth Male Vocalist of the Year at the 2022 CMA Awards, setting the record for most wins ever in the category, and gave a rousing performance of the National Anthem at Super Bowl LVII. Currently in the midst of his extensive "All-American Road Show" tour, Stapleton recently announced his new album, Higher, will release in November. The new album follows 2020's acclaimed Starting Over, which went on to win three awards at the 67th Annual Grammys-Best Country Album, Best Country Solo Performance ("You Should Probably Leave") and Best Country Song ("Cold") – in addition to earning Album of the Year honors at both the CMA and ACM Awards.

Carrie Underwood is a multi-format, multi-media superstar, spanning achievements in music, television and film, and as a New York Times bestselling author and successful entrepreneur. She has sold more than 85 million records worldwide and recorded 28 No. 1 singles-14 of which she co-wrote. She is the most-awarded female country artist for singles in RIAA history and has seven albums that are certified multi-Platinum or Platinum by the RIAA, with over 72 million total RIAA certifications to date, all while continuing to sell out arena tours across North America and the UK. Underwood released her most recent album, Denim & Rhinestones, in 2022, and she also recently completed her 43-city U.S. arena tour, "The Denim & Rhinestones Tour." In addition to becoming the first artist to perform at the new Resorts World Theatre with her ongoing "Reflection: The Las Vegas Residency," Underwood just launched her exclusive year-round SiriusXM channel, Carrie's Country. Her deluxe edition of Denim & Rhinestones, featuring six new tracks, will be out on Sept. 22.

With over 18 billion on-demand streams and nine charttoppers at country radio, Morgan Wallen has had unparalleled success since his debut in 2016. His second full-length project, Dangerous: The Double Album, topped 2021's all-genre Billboard 200 Albums year-end chart and notched historical chart status as Billboard's longest running Top 10 album in history for a solo artist. Wallen followed the 5-time Platinum, ACM Album of the Year with 2023's 36-song, deeply personal third studio album, One Thing At A Time, which reigned atop the all-genre Billboard 200 chart for 12 consecutive weeks, the most weeks at No. 1 for a country album in over 30 years. Wallen recently became first artist to have three singles simultaneously in the top 10 on country radio with "Last Night," "One Thing At A Time" and "Thought You Should Know." He is currently on his "One Night At A Time World Tour," crisscrossing the globe and breaking attendance records in his wake.
